The Seven Sacred Teachings of the Grandfathers Truth is to know all of these things: To learn Truth, to live with Truth, to walk with Truth, and to speak Truth, not deceiving yourself or others. Truth is to know the difference between

HUMILITY

HONESTY

Humility is to know yourself as a sacred part of Creation. You are equal to others, no better or no less. Humble yourself and recognize that no matter how much you think you know, you know very little of all the Universe.

Always be <u>Honest</u> in word and action. Be <u>Honest</u> first with yourself, and you will more easily be able to be <u>Honest</u> with others.

Courage or Bravery is to face the fae with integrity. It is to do what is right even when the consequences are unpleasant or painful. To have the mental and moral strength to overcome fears that prevent us from living our true spirit as human beings is a great challenge.

Wisdom is given by the Creator to be used for the good of the people. To have Wisdom is to know the difference between good and bad, and to know the consequences of one's actions.

LOVE

To know <u>Love</u> is to know peace. <u>Love</u> must be unconditional. When people are weak, they need <u>Love</u> the most. If one cannot <u>Love</u> oneself, it is impossible to Love anyone else. Spirituality is at the core of this teaching. Love is Reciprocal.

ESPECT

To honor all Creation is to have <u>Respect</u>. All of Creation should be treated with <u>Respect</u>. One must <u>Respect</u> others, their beliefs, and <u>Respect</u> yourself. If you cannot show <u>Respect</u> for others, you cannot expect it to be given to you. Like Love, it is <u>Reciprocal</u>.
